FROM THE PASTOR

²⁷Now you are the body of Christ and individually members of it.²⁸And God has appointed in the church first apostles, second prophets, third teachers; then deeds of power, then gifts of healing, forms of assistance, forms of leadership, various kinds of tongues. ²⁹Are all apostles? Are all prophets? Are all teachers? Do all work miracles? ³⁰Do all possess gifts of healing? Do all speak in tongues? Do all interpret? ³¹But strive for the greater gifts. And I will show you a still more excellent way.
(I Corinthians 12:27-31, NRSV)

Many of you have no doubt read or heard the passage above before, some of you many times. In his letter to the church in Corinth, Paul is encouraging them to work together as best they can for the spread of the Gospel. It seems that in the early church many people had gotten the idea that certain "spiritual gifts" were more or less important than others. (One that was particularly prized was speaking in tongues, which Paul puts at the bottom of the list then later spends some time downplaying.)

Notice that as he presents his list of gifts Paul

makes it clear that every one is important to the healthy functioning of the church. In other letters Paul uses similar imagery of the church as the Body of Christ as well, and he is always quick to point out the importance of all the parts. This is as true in the Church today as it was in Paul's time, and as true at St. Mark's as it was in Corinth, Rome, Ephesus or anyplace else the Church existed or exists today.

Unfortunately, "so much to do, so little time" seems to have become the catch phrase of our society these days, both in the church and in other areas of life. And it is true that while opportunities abound, our time is limited. It has usually been my experience though, that I am able to find the time to do those things that are, first of all, most important, but also those things that I am either most interested in or am good at doing. (They are not always the same!) If we look honestly at the ways we spend our time, I think most of us could say the same thing. Fortunately, St. Mark's has need for your participation in a wide variety of areas, all of which are important, and at least one of which is likely to be something you either enjoy or are good at, or both. If we see these needs as opportunities to use our interests and skills rather than burdens to bear, perhaps we will be more likely to see that there can be both enjoyment and fulfillment in

serving God by serving the Church.

You may not be aware that we have twelve "official" ministries of the congregation that carry out the work of St. Mark's. They are, Stewardship, Finance/Endowment, Evangelism, Worship/Music/Arts, Christian Education, Youth, Social Service, Property, Fellowship, Communications, Mutual Ministry, and Administration/Records.

As you might be able to tell from the titles of these ministries, they cover a wide variety of activities and responsibilities. Most of our ministries are quite vital and functioning very well, but they can always use new folks with fresh ideas and enthusiasm.

One ministry in particular that is in need of members right now is Administration/Records. While its title does not sound particularly "churchy," it is essential to the smooth functioning of our congregation nonetheless. When questions arise as to updated documents, organization of information, or proper distribution of information, we turn to Administration/Records for answers. If you have interests and/or abilities in the area of organizational skills, please speak to Council President Jim Carl or me about ways you might help strengthen this Body we call St. Mark's.

The same is true of any other ministry you might be interested in. Let us know what areas your interests

and abilities are in and we can find a way to help you exercise them for the good of the church. Think of something you like to do, and it is almost certain there is way the Church can benefit from your involvement. God grants us a wide variety of gifts because the world has a wide variety of needs to be met. What better place to bring gift and need together than in the church!

Be sure to attend the congregational meeting on June 7th to learn more about any ministry you may have questions about and to let us know how we can help you use your gifts to build up the Body of Christ at St. Mark's.

SMYG goin' to New Orleans... again!

As many of you know St. Mark's Youth Group is returning to the Gulf Coast. I hope that this article will inform you all of what God has planned for us to do this summer.

Our travel will begin on July Saturday 18th. We will be leaving the Susquehanna Township High School parking lot around 6PM. (Come see us go if you are free!) We will be travelling by bus, along with 130 other participants that are taking part in the "Gathering EXTENDED" Mission Trip that is being offered by LutheranHANDS. The bus ride will be around 22 hours. (Are we there yet?) We will arrive at Camp Victor in Ocean Springs Mississippi Sunday evening July 19th.

We will begin our mission work bright and early Monday morning at 630AM. We will work through Wednesday afternoon. We will have no idea how we are going to serve until we arrive at Camp Victor. We know that God will put the tools we need in our hands and hearts that we need to serve those on the gulf coast. Wednesday afternoon we will travel the one hour and twenty minute drive to New Orleans for the ELCA National Youth Gathering (NYG). This drive has a great impact because the route we will be driving was all devastated by the hurricanes and flooding.

There are three full days to the NYG, they include a day of service, a day of "learning", and a day of theology. These three main themes of the gathering will be endeared by morning worships, evening free time activities, and nighttime SMYG devotions. SMYG has also signed up to be a part of serving as communion assistants for Sunday morning worship. The members of SMYG will be helping serve communion to over 36,000 Lutherans!!!

We will depart New Orleans on Sunday afternoon around 3PM. This means SMYG will return to the Susquehanna Township High School around 2PM on Monday July 27th. Again please feel free to come show your support on our return.

If you feel like you can help in any way please do.

With all of this travel we can definitely use your prayers. In other congregations there are members creating small devotions including a scripture with a quick thought for their youth to read along the way. This is one more way to contribute to our mission. Lastly, if you are still able to financially help the trip in any way, please mark your giving envelope for the "SMYG Mission Trip". With this notation your gift will go directly to our efforts of serving the Gulf Coast. Thanks again for all of your help! We will return the gratitude with another Mission Sunday as we have traditionally done.

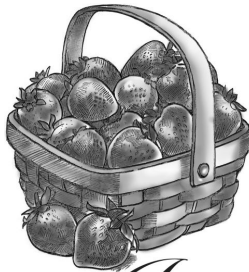
