MISSION STATEMENT: Nourished by Word and Sacrament, the mission of the members of St. Mark's Evangelical Lutheran Church is to spread God's Word in Jesus Christ through our thoughts, words, and actions, proclaiming God's good news for all to hear and live.



I want to know Christ and the power of his resurrection and the sharing of his sufferings by becoming like him in his death, ¹¹if somehow I may attain the resurrection from the dead.

¹²Not that I have already obtained this or have already reached the goal; but I press on to make it my own, because Christ Jesus has made me his own. ¹³Beloved, I do not consider that I have made it my own but this one thing I do: forgetting what lies behind and straining forward to what lies ahead, ¹⁴I press on toward the goal for the prize of the

heavenly call of God in Christ Jesus. Philippians 3:10-14 (NRSV)

Prompted by some of my recent reading, two questions have been running through my mind. Actually, they are more like two sides of the same question expanding on the simple thought of "What if?". The questions I have been pondering are "What if I would have?", and "What if I would?".

What if I *would have* stuck to the healthy eating habits I have practiced off and on for much of my adult life?
What if I *would* renew and stick to those habits from now into the future?
What if I *would have* kept up the exercise routines of when I was into bodybuilding, powerlifting, or running?
What if I *would* adopt and commit to a similar exercise habit today and for the rest of my life?
What if I *would have* paid attention to the practice and promises of Biblical stewardship that I was taught?
What if I *would* make a real effort to commit to those principles and more from now on?
What if I *would have* continued in the habit my mother instilled in me of attending church and Sunday school?
What if I *would* ...well that's kind of a moot point considering my current situation!

Those last two questions are especially pertinent to us as a congregation and as the whole Christian church.

In times of reflection we often look back and ask, "What if?" or think "If only". Along with those thoughts can come a feeling of despair and regret, as if it is too late to do anything about the missed opportunities or wasted time and effort of our past. What can we do about it now? While it's true that we can't change the past, we can learn from it and make changes in the future. We can follow St. Paul's example; **"forgetting what lies behind and straining forward to what lies ahead**, ¹⁴I press on toward the goal for the prize of the heavenly call of God in Christ Jesus." Every day is a fresh start, a new beginning; a chance to pick ourselves up, brush ourselves off, and strive to be the people God is calling us to be.

We can only surmise what might be if we "would have" but we can be pretty certain that we will grow closer to becoming the people God wants us to be if we "do". And it is never too late to begin pressing on toward the goal. The choices we make and the actions we take *now* can have long-lasting effects, sometimes for long after we leave this earth.

Our diet and exercise choices can help to prolong both the quantity and quality of our years. The example we set with those habits can influence the next generation as well. That might set in motion a long and effective chain of one generation after another taking better care of themselves. It might even have an impact on things like the cost and availability of health care in the future.

The choices we make and actions we take concerning our faith may be even more influential in the future, both during, and long after, our lifetime. Weekly church attendance will enhance our own spiritual life and will set an example for our children and grandchildren to emulate. Making worship and learning about our faith something we regularly do, rather than a chore or obligation, shows future generations the importance of a strong faith life, especially as life gets more complicated and difficult. I am a perfect example of what can happen when the seed is planted early. There was a time when my spiritual growth was "stunted" to say the least. Over time, however, God found a way to fertilize that seed and get me to where I am today. Like Paul, I know I haven't yet fully become all God wants me to be, but I believe I am much closer to it because of my early upbringing in the church.

Unfortunately, Biblical stewardship was something I pretty much had to learn on my own. In my family it was always important to give something to the church but giving in proportion to our blessings was not. As an adult with a good job, getting more and more involved in the church, I found I had a desire to work toward tithing as called for in the Bible. It certainly didn't happen all at once, but I have grown in my giving as I have grown in my faith, and I believe the blessings I have received (though not necessarily financial) have grown as well.

One shining example of Biblical stewardship that will have a long-lasting effect here at St. Mark's is a memorial bequest from the estate of Harriett Mark in memory of her and her husband Bob. This bequest is perhaps the largest one-time gift St. Mark's has ever received. I don't know for sure what Harriett's giving habits were when she was living (only the Financial Secretary has record of individual contributions) but we might assume that someone who was so generous to the church at her death was also supportive during her lifetime. Being a good steward, Harriett lived well within her means, managed her finances wisely, and so was able to be of generous benefit, not only to Saint Mark's but to several charitable causes as well. (Please note that, as a Memorial Contribution, the bequest from Harriett's estate will, in accordance with longstanding St. Mark's policy, not be used to pay current expenses, those are the responsibility of those of us giving regularly to support the mission and ministry of the church. Undesignated bequests such as this are managed by the Finance Ministry in accordance with guidelines established for such funds.) Our church and our community, through the people we minister to, is truly blessed by this generous gift.

What if we would make good physical and spiritual habits the norm for the future? How might our ministry and mission be enhanced? How might we, as the Body of Christ, grow stronger and healthier? What if we would work together in a commitment to **press on toward the goal for the prize of the heavenly call of God in Christ Jesus?** We may never know what *might have* been, but what *could be* is limited only by God's will and the power of the Holy Spirit, in other words UNLIMITED!


The cost of one nursery is \$150, that is our goal. If we receive more funds than the above amount, we will purchase more individual trees or another nursery.
