For everything that was written in the past was written to teach us, so that through the endurance taught in the Scriptures and the encouragement they provide we might have hope. ⁵ May the God who gives endurance and encouragement give you the same attitude of mind toward each other that Christ Jesus had, ⁶ so that with one mind and one voice you may glorify the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ. Romans 15:1-6 NIV

On July 20, I had the unique opportunity and privilege of speaking at the Pennsylvania Weekend Firefighters' Memorial Service at the National Fire Academy in Emmitsburg,

Maryland. Over 200 firefighters from all over Pennsylvania, as well as some from other places, attended that service in memory of five PA firefighters who lost their lives in the line of duty in 2018. It was an emotionally moving experience and an extraordinary display of unity and camaraderie. That unity and camaraderie is one of the first things I noticed when I became Chaplain of the Colonial Park Fire Dept. It seems to be a common characteristic of many organizations that work together to face critical, and sometimes dangerous, situations.

Paul calls for the same kind of unity, camaraderie, and cooperation in the church. The church today, just like in Paul's day, is in a critical and sometimes dangerous situation, whether we realize it and/or recognize it or not. The situation is critical because there are many people around us who have not been moved by the Good News of Jesus Christ. They may have heard about Jesus, they may have some experience of church or religion of some kind, but when it comes to the Gospel making a real difference for them, "it just ain't happenin"! Many of those people, regardless of their personal faith or feelings about God, Jesus, and the Church, turn to us for help in times of need. Most of them have had the experience of the church coming to their aid when they need it, hopefully with no strings attached. What they see when they come to us tells them what Christians are like, and the way we work together determines how well we can fulfill the commandment to love our neighbors as ourselves. Responding with unity, camaraderie, and cooperation is our best hope of fulfilling that commandment to the best of our ability.

The danger the church finds itself in is not so much physical as it is existential. If we fail to work together in unified ministry, there is a danger that the church will become irrelevant and perhaps even cease to exist. Imagine a team of firefighters battling a blaze with each member wanting to do his or her own thing. Imagine an EMS crew trying to save someone's life while performing procedures that conflict with one another. How about National Guard troops attempting to save a community from a flood with each one running off in a different direction while their comrades need their help? Those emergency responders have learned to work together regardless of personal preferences or personality conflicts.

We, of course, are not called to "save" people like those emergency responders, Jesus already did that. We are called to bring that good news to them in a way that makes a real difference in their lives. Like Paul, we must pray that the God who gives endurance and encouragement gives us the same attitude of mind toward each other that Christ Jesus had, so that with one mind and one voice we may glorify the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ. We are not in this alone, nor are we in this for ourselves. God is with us, and the Church exists for the hope of the world; to carry on the mission and ministry of Jesus, empowered by the Holy Spirit, until he returns.

Paul's call to unity of heart and mind is in no way unique to his letter to the church in Rome. As I have been studying the Epistles this summer, I have found that call to oneness to be an often-recurring theme. Perhaps the church hasn't changed much in 2000 years. Perhaps Paul struggled with some of the same issues of human nature we deal with today. We know in our hearts, though, "It has always been that way" is no reason it must continue to be that way. We are doing some great ministry here at St. Mark's. I am encouraged by what we *are* doing and excited about what we *can* do. With an attitude of camaraderie, unity, and cooperation, "one for all and all for one", we can continue to make a real difference in our community and the world.

W/ELCA is collecting the following items for Lutheran World Relief during the months of July and August.

Personal Care Kit

- —One light-weight bath-sized towel, dark color recommended. (Minimum size 20" x 40"; Maximum size 52" x 27")
- —Soap, two or three bath size bars equaling 8 to 9 oz., and brand, in its original packaging.
- —One sturdy comb, (wide-tooth preferred)
- One metal nail clipper, (attached file is optional, but not necessary.

School Kits

- -(4) 70 sheet notebooks of wide or college ruled paper Approximately 8" x 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ " (NO LOOSE LEAF PAPER)
- −30 centimeter ruler, or a ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other.
- -(5) unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers
- -Pencil sharpener
- Blunt scissors (safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well)
- -(5) Ballpoint pens, black or blue ink only (NO Gel ink)
- —Eraser, approximately 2½" long.
- −Box of 16 or 24 crayons.

The items can be placed at either entrance to the sanctuary.
