Lately we've been talking a lot about stewardship, and not always in a positive sense. I once heard someone say the funny thing about money is, when you have enough you don't think about it, but when you don't have enough, it's all you think about. I guess that may be as true for the church as it is in our homes. I'd like to take a different approach this month, though, and talk about the good side of our stewardship here at St. Mark's.

First, I want to thank all the people who give generously of their time and talent as well as their money. Many of you do so much behind the scenes and in support of our ministry and are never properly thanked for your ministry. In fact, there may be no way to fully express my gratitude and that of the church for all you do. Like Paul in his letter to the Corinthian Church, I think of you often and I give thanks for all the good things that happen here and beyond our walls. Worship, community breakfasts, collections for the less fortunate, sharing of our space with groups that benefit the community; none of these things would be possible without the generous giving of many people. Too often we focus so intently on what we don't have or what we are not doing, that we lose sight of the many good and generous things we do have and are doing. God has been good to St. Mark's and we are doing a lot to share that goodness. To quote Paul, "it's beyond speech, beyond knowledge. The evidence of Christ has been clearly verified in your lives."

As I write this, we are in the middle of the season of Advent, a time of anticipation and preparation, a season of waiting, as we look forward to the day when Christ comes to make all things new. Paul talks about this expectant waiting in his greeting to the Corinthian church; "Just think—you don't need a thing, you've got it all! All God's gifts are right in front of you as you wait expectantly for our Master Jesus to arrive on the scene for the Finale." Now, I'm sure we could argue about Paul's statement that we don't need a thing. I think a big part of the discussion would come down to the difference between what we need and what we want. But we certainly can't deny that God's gifts are right in front of us, especially as we have just received his most wonderful and precious gift, Jesus the Messiah! Once we realize the abundance with which God has blessed us, it is only natural that we want to share that abundance with others, whether in be financial, physical, skills, time, or any other resource we are able to share.

"And not only that, but God himself is right alongside to keep you steady and on track until things are all wrapped up by Jesus. God, who got you started in this spiritual adventure, shares with us the life of his Son and our Master Jesus. He will never give up on you. Never forget that." When it seems as if we've given all we can, or that we simply can't afford to do more, we need to remember this reassurance of God's walking with us, to help us along and continue his abundant blessings. Jesus promises that God will care for us and, in my experience, that promise is true. As long as we are not wasteful, greedy, or just plain stupid with what God provides, God will see that our needs are met. Again,

this is true in the church as well as in our individual lives. The church may experience tight financial situations, this has been true in the past and unfortunately probably will be true in the future as well. But, even in those situations we must not be afraid to be about the ministry God calls us to as the Body of Christ. Christ has called us together as a body that strengthens its members by working together, with each one doing what they can to make the whole body strong. It is that spirit of strength and unity that has kept St. Mark's, as well as the Lutheran Church in general, going for so long. It is that same spirit of strength and unity that will keep us strong far into the future.

What can I say that you haven't already heard? Perhaps a tale more reflective of how the Romanians may view these 5 Americans as packages are prepared for the children in their city and neighboring villages may be of interest. These quips are purely my observation, not substantiated by any facts.

- * None of the Americans are fluent in Romanian. However, a traditional greeting in Romanian is truly appreciated.
- * These Americans are rich. They can travel to this country and purchase all these items for our children.
- * Moving or carrying a lot of large items is expected to be completed by men. They will drop everything they are working on to help a female.
- * Home cooked meals are often pre-plated and presented in front of you. You are expected to finish your plate, or else your hosts will feel they did not cook to your liking. The meals are usually 4-5 courses, so pace yourself.
- * Even the littlest ones are extremely observant. They will know if you are annoyed, impatient or angry. Keep your emotions in check and count to ten.
- * Remember that your own way doesn't mean it's the best way. You're a guest on their turf and you have to go with it.
- * Being an active part of a mission team takes patience and FLEXIBILITY. Without being able to manage these key concepts, you will surely fail and bring the team down with you.
- * Past decades brought 5,000 orphans some Christmas joy. This year was only budgeted for 2,500 care packages. With God's help, we were able to stretch those funds and prepare 3,300. I can't help but think about the remaining 2,100 kids who received something last year, but will receive nothing but our prayers this year. It is heartbreaking. May the Lord bring them comfort in knowing they are not forgotten.

LESSONS IN WISE FAITH

"The Magi teach us true faith," said Martin Luther. Given the obstacles they encountered, we would understand if they had given up altogether!

First, the travelers were "off the mark," coming to Jerusalem to seek a newborn king in a "royal palace." Then, directed to Bethlehem, the wise men found a sight "so utterly out of keeping with a king" — a poor young woman and child, in a "poor hut" — that one might expect them to head straight home. "But," declares Luther, "with a great, strong and full faith they ... follow the word of the prophet and the witness of the star in all purity of heart," bowing to worship and honor the Savior.
