Mark 12:29-33 NRSV

I recently had a nice week of "staycation". While I took a week away from the church, we didn't go away. I spent time with Marian and our family while Marian had pretty much her regular routine of watching grandsons and sewing, housework, etc. We enjoyed a couple special evenings out and I got to work on a few projects around the house and yard that have been pending for some time.

I find that working in the yard and garden, and immersing myself in other projects, gives me a chance to ponder life and ministry. The nature of that kind of "work" can be meditative, and during my week off I got to spend a good amount of time in this meditative activity. While I worked and pondered, the passage above from Mark's gospel seemed to come to mind often. It led me to consider, and recommit to, a couple things in my life and my ministry.

First, in my ministry, I am making a renewed commitment to visiting and otherwise connecting with members and visitors of St. Mark's. I realize there are a number of shut-ins and others I have not visited in too long a while. I am sorry for not seeing you more often and hope you'll forgive me as I make a concerted effort to reconnect. I have asked Council to hold me accountable on this commitment and they have agreed to handle as much of the church's activities as possible in ministries to allow me the opportunity to spend my time "on the road."

Hand in hand with the renewed commitment to visitation and communication is a renewed commitment to self-care. As Jesus says to love our neighbors as ourselves, love of neighbor, in visiting, etc., requires love of self to keep things in perspective, and to maintain the health, energy, and enthusiasm to do the ministry Jesus calls us to. As I interpret Jesus' command, we are to love the Lord with all our emotion (heart) spirit (soul) mind (intellect) and body (strength). It is this complete love of the Lord that requires that we take complete care of the self.

Emotionally, we all experience times of joy, sadness, anger, frustration, etc. The tricky part is to know how we dedicate all these different emotions to the Lord. While some emotions are clinically beyond our control without proper treatment, for the most part we can learn how to truly appreciate the positive emotions as gifts of God and use the less-than-positive as opportunities to work for positive change, both in ourselves and the situations we face.

Spiritually, of course, loving the Lord means worship, study, meditation, and devotion. We are made in the image of God and instilled with the gift of the Holy Spirit at baptism. We should always strive to turn to the Spirit for guidance, hope, and direction.

Intellectually there is always a lot to learn about our faith from the very basics, like the Creed, Lord's Prayer and Ten Commandments, to more mundane issues like the history, as well as the future, of our denomination. Time spent studying our faith is time devoted to loving the Lord more completely.

And finally, loving the Lord with our bodies means appreciating and caring for this wonderful gift of life we have been given. Careless treatment of this "temple of the Holy Spirit" as St. Paul calls it, reflects a lack of love and appreciation for what is, perhaps, the most amazing creation the Creator has ever created.

As I renew my commitment to loving both neighbor and self, I ask for your continued support, understanding, and love. "This is much more important than all whole burnt offerings and sacrifices."

PENTECOST POWER

Ten days after Jesus ascended into heaven, the Holy Spirit descended onto Jesus' disciples. While they were gathered in Jerusalem to celebrate the Jewish festival of Pentecost, the disciples saw flames among and on them, heard a rushing wind and began talking in many languages. As a result, the disciples were able to share the good news of Jesus in the native tongues of all the pilgrims assembled in the city.

Even today, the power of the Holy Spirit fuels the "flame" that ignites Christians' outreach efforts. Only by the Spirit's power can we know Christ and make him known throughout the world.

Poet William Blake (1757-1827), who's been described as a passionate, Pentecost kind of person, wrote this poem about the Spirit's power:


