As I write this we are in the midst of a historic pandemic, the spread of COVID-19, Coronavirus. We have been encouraged to cancel worship and other church activities, which we have. We are being asked to practice "social distancing", which ironically, in my opinion,

we have been doing for some time already. While social media has become a greater influence in our lives, our actual social interaction has been on the decline.

As I ponder this situation it is my humble opinion that our lack of physical contact with others, as well as with nature, is weakening us and making us all the more vulnerable to things like COVID-19 when they arise. In recent history we have experienced the lessening popularity of things like recreational leagues, social and civic clubs, service organizations and dwindling attendance at many worship services and church functions. As a result, we are no longer exposed to as large a variety of small doses of "invaders" or threats to our immune systems, doses that just might help us build up a tolerance for the bigger invaders when they arise.

We are created by God to live in relationship, first to God, then to one another. Adam was not complete without Eve and we are not complete without others to share our good times, bad times, and, most of all our faith. I understand the need for caution during pandemics and other threats to public health, but when there is no threat, let's take the advice of the author of the letter to the Hebrews, to meet together in church and elsewhere more often. I believe that by doing so we will make each stronger physically, mentally, and especially, spiritually.

On a brighter note, I want to take this opportunity to publicly welcome St. Mark's new Administrative Assistant, Loraine (with one "r") Mariner. Loraine volunteered a few months back to "fill in" upon the resignation of our former Administrative Assistant, Kim DiPaolo. While she was filling in, in the spirit of fairness to all involved, we conducted a search for other candidates to take on the job full-time, but without success. After interviewing Loraine, we decided she was our best choice for the position, and she is doing a great job so far.

Bitter Sweet

I have been thinking about how I can better my purpose here in Romania. I am always seeking ideas for improving lessons, and make them more interesting for the children without constant expense. Then I was the recipient of sad news. A potential client at the Hagar House was interviewed by staff for possible entry and met with the other moms and babies. The following day she was murdered. It shook the house to the core. Since I did not see the televised news, I can only speculate that she was probably a victim of domestic violence. I don't know the whereabouts of her child. Yet another victim of society (familiar in our country as well). I have to refocus and try to redirect them to happier times.

On to the next shelter (Reaching Out). The social worker has the flu and really should not be here to work a 24-hour shift. I offered to take her place in helping with dinner in the hope of protecting everyone from getting sick. So, what to do with a dozen eggs and a lot of frozen (freezer burnt) veggies? I decided to go with a deconstructed frittata since the oven does not work. We sautéed frozen veggies (spinach, carrots, green beans), onions and garlic in a stock pot, added cooked potatoes and whipped eggs with milk and seasonings. Then let it steam in the stock pot. Couldn't believe it was edible (and the girls hate spinach!) Again, had to refocus the girls making dinner and giving the social worker a break.

I was asked to give a ride home to a family visiting one of the girls at the shelter. Luckily, I had to clear it first with my boss and she said no, much to my relief. Of course, I didn't mind giving a ride, but I certainly didn't want to accept liability should anything happen. I also didn't want to set any kind of precedent. Still, I feel a twinge of guilt because of the situation.

Finally, praying for clear counsel on whether the mission trip back to the Ukraine will take place this summer. It is a time of corruption and political unrest, an all too familiar tune. I would drive there (8 hours plus 2 border crossings), which may come with its own slew of challenges.

So, just as we all experience ups and downs in our daily happenings, the same happens here, just different circumstances and languages. They grieve as we do, and rejoice in good times. May we be diligent in holding each other in prayer. Amen.

Infinite Love

March 8th is celebrated as International Women's Day. In Romania, all women and girls are treated with trinkets and flowers from family, friends and strangers alike. It is like our Mother's Day on steroids! A traditional Romanian dish served on this day is "măcinici" with pasta shaped like "8" to symbolize the infinity of a mother's love. As Christians, we also celebrate God's infinite love for us, unconditionally, through good times and bad.

I have a few blessings to share with you. First, after more than 4 months of red tape, I finally received my temporary residency card. So, I am cleared to stay in Romania until January 2021. Second, I was elated to hear that an 18-year-old sex-trafficking victim who was discharged from one of the shelters continues to attend school and seems to be adjusting well in society. Third, I have been accepted on the East European Missions Network (EEMN) bible camp team, and I look forward to teaching the kids in the Ukraine again in June, before coming home for 6 weeks this summer.

There are also a few prayer requests that I have. One is for the acceptance of visa paperwork so that my Romanian friend, Raluca and her baby Cristina will be able to accompany me to the USA in June for a visit. I learned from my experience that something routine quickly evolves into complications. The next request is for guidance for creative expressions of love through children's lessons, activities and crafts. I sent a "wish list" of supplies to Molly Stanton for your prayerful consideration. I also welcome any suggestions you have from previous activities in Sunday School, Vacation Bible School, youth group activities, etc. The only criteria are that the activities are simplistic and inexpensive for the materials. I usually translate the activity to fit younger children at church (7-14 years old), teenage girls from the shelter (although their attention span is more like middle school age), and young mothers from the other shelter. I will also adapt whatever materials are donated to accompany classroom supplies in the Ukraine. I take to heart 5 loaves and 2 fish, so nothing is wasted and your donations will touch dozens of children, and in turn, their loved ones. Lastly, please keep my family and me in your prayers. Though we are accustomed to being miles apart, technology cannot replace kisses and hugs!!!
