

"Not that I have already obtained this or have already reached the goal; but I press on to make it my own, because Christ Jesus has made me his own. ¹³Beloved, I do not consider that I have made it my own; but this one thing I do: forgetting what lies behind and straining forward to what lies ahead, ¹⁴I press on toward the goal for the prize of the heavenly call of God in Christ Jesus." Philippians 4:12-14 (NRSV)

Paul's words to the church in Philippi, quoted above, have always been some of my favorite words in all of scripture. When I wonder what it is God has in mind for me, I turn to Paul's example and simply keep "pressing on" with the understanding that, whatever it is God has in store, God will show me the way to go. As I see God at work in so many ways at St. Mark's these days, I believe that is also a good way for us to approach the future God has in store for us as a church.

What Paul talks about not having already obtained is knowing Christ and becoming like him. Those are, of course, lofty goals that, by the power of the Holy Spirit, we will obtain when we leave this world for the next. Until then, we keep pressing on, "forgetting what lies behind."

Again, to put Paul's words into context, he doesn't expect us to give up all our history, tradition, or heritage. What Paul was leaving behind, and what we should work to leave behind, are the things from our past that have held us back in our pursuit of the goal God has for us. History, tradition, and heritage can be good things if we use them as a foundation to build on for the future.

I also like the verses following the passage above, this time quoted from *The Message*, a paraphrase of scripture by Eugene Petersen, "So let's keep focused on that goal, those of us who want everything God has for us. If any of you have something else in mind, something less than total commitment, God will clear your blurred vision—you'll see it yet! Now that we're on the right track, let's stay on it."

Petersen's version makes it clear that sometimes we need to get moving, and keep moving, before the path is made clear. I believe we are on the right track and so I say, "Let's stay on it!"

Recently we have seen renewed vigor and enthusiasm in several of our ministries. The Evangelism Ministry has had some exciting meetings and has come up with some great ideas for outreach within and beyond our walls. The Stewardship Ministry is working to find ways to both encourage and educate us on the importance of Biblical Stewardship. The Worship and Music Ministry has come up with some wonderful ways to enhance the already Spirit-filled worship of St. Mark's. The Easter Vigil, held here for the first time in a long time, is one example of one such successful addition to our Holy Week schedule. The blending of music by our Spirit and Truth Band into the 8:15 and 11:00 services has been, for the most part, a welcome addition to our worship. (By the way, Marian and I attended the concert SATB put on at St. Peter's in Middletown and we were both struck with a new appreciation for the talent and gifts we are so fortunate to have in our midst.)

Whatever new and exciting things that are happening are in addition to the many wonderful things that have been happening all along here at St. Mark's. The Fellowship Ministry continues to find ways to bring us together (mostly around food, of course) and to raise some funds to help offset the cost of some of our "extracurricular activities. The Christian Education Ministry has been building a great Sunday School and Confirmation program that saw eight young-sters receive their First Holy Communion and three youth will be confirmed on Pentecost Sunday, May 20th. Also, the Confirmation Class project set a wonderful example for emphasizing different aspects of our ministry throughout the year and I would like to see our standing ministries take on and continue that effort.

Our youth groups, Lutheran Youth of Faith (LYF), and LYF Jr. are among the most active and vibrant anywhere. The ministry they provide to the youth of our congregation and community is an essential part of faith formation for those young people when it matters most. And, in the area of Youth and Family Ministry, our annual family Retreat has grown from the first year's participation of just 11 people to this year's total of over 40 participants, in just three years.

Thanks to two grants we have received, the Property Ministry has some exciting work to do as well. We have also received a generous bequest from the estate of Helen Kegerreis, earmarked for capital improvements and/or building expansion that will help with improvements to our facilities over and above simple, necessary maintenance. (See Council President Nick Zingone's article for more on what the Property Ministry has in store. Yes, we are on the right track;

let's stay on it!

Of course, like Paul and individual Christians everywhere, there are some areas in which we could improve. Communication, both internal and external is one that immediately comes to mind. If you have skills in this, or any other area that might help St. Mark's **"press on toward the goal of the heavenly call of God in Christ Jesus"** please speak up, step up, and help us to stay on the right track.

COUNCIL PRESIDENT

Have you ever felt like you're having a bad week and you just can't shake the feeling, when something occurs to suddenly renew you? From that moment your perspective shifts with the revelation and it gives you a new sense of purpose. I experienced such a moment this morning hearing verses 14-16 from chapter 10 of John's Gospel:

I am the good shepherd; I know my own and my own know me, as the Father knows me and I know the Father; and I lay down my life for the sheep. <u>And I have other sheep, that are not of this fold; I must bring them also, and they will heed my voice. So there shall be one flock, one shepherd.</u>

It was verse 16 (underlined) that had the most profound impact. In that moment it was the reminder that Jesus wants everyone to be part of His flock, not just those who are already members of a Christian congregation. We do a pretty job caring for the 500+ sheep who make up the flock of St. Mark's. Are there opportunities to improve? Sure.

Now let's consider those sheep around us who are not yet part of the flock. It's incredible when you start to think how many non-members our ministry touches on a regular basis. Try to add up everyone who attends a group meeting in our facility, eats a meal at our community breakfasts, attends our Nursery School, receives food via the Nutripack program, and on and on. That number certainly reaches into the thousands!

Our physical facilities (building and grounds) are at the core of the ministry we provide. You could even liken our church structure to the physical enclosure that would surround a flock of sheep keeping them safe. With all the people we serve, it is vital that we ensure this physical space is adequate for our current and future needs. It's all the more reason to ensure we continue making investments in our facilities to ensure they support rather then hinder our mission. That's why our property ministry has prioritized the Fellowship Hall for renovations over the coming months. As preparation and planning are underway, I encourage your participation by attending upcoming property ministry meetings. If you're unable to make a meeting you are welcome to speak with members of the ministry such as Chris Bair, Randy Whitaker, or Pastor Person to ask questions or provide input for the project.

Other Recent Council Action:

Approved a request to guarantee financial support to three youth desiring to attend summer camp in excess of budget should they be unable to obtain a campership from the Lutheran Camping Corporation. Total commitment not to exceed \$675 allocated from undesignated Extravaganza proceeds.
