Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." John 20:21

While preparing Bible study for the Second Sunday of Easter I came across an interesting note in my folder for John 20:19-31, the Gospel reading for that Sunday; just over 22 years ago, on April 6, 1997, I preached my first "real" sermon right here at St. Mark's on this very passage. At that time, I was a 40-year-old, second career seminary student who had come to St. Mark's for Teaching Parish. Along with me came my wife, Marian and two children

Eli, 16, and Sarah, 12.

One thing my family and I will always remember is the way we were greeted when we came here. From the very first day we were taken in as if we had been here all our lives. We felt instantly that St. Mark's was our home away from home. This was especially important to us since our family was, and mostly still is, three hours away in Greensburg and Latrobe. Our son, now 38, is still living in Western PA with his wife Lisa, while Sarah and her husband Michael Williams live right here in Harrisburg with our two wonderful, amazing, incredible, fantastic, grandsons, Brooks and Teddy. We had an especially blessed Easter experience this year as Sarah, Michael and the boys joined us for worship and were welcome by our St. Mark's family just as we have been over these past 22 years.

It is hard to explain our relationship with St. Mark's in any way other than to say it is God's plan for us. Of all the places we could have been assigned for Teaching Parish, we ended up here. We were even told that some congregations discouraged students from bringing their families with them on Sundays during Teaching Parish. This was, at least in part, due to the responsibility of the congregation to provide a meal and conversation with the student following worship and apparently some congregations felt that was too much of a burden to be expected. Here, however, I was told that the congregation would be disappointed if I did not bring the whole family and every Sunday enhanced that family experience and strengthened our relationship with St. Mark's.

When Teaching Parish ended, I had an unexplainable feeling that we would someday be back at St. Mark's. That feeling proved true when graduation time came, and I received a call to St. Mark's as Associate Pastor. Our experience as members of the St. Mark's family was renewed and my experience, along with Pastor Kiser's mentorship, proved invaluable to my life in ordained ministry. That early experience was somewhat short-lived, however, as God had other things in mind for us. With an opening at Prince of Peace Lutheran church in Latrobe, Marian's hometown, we made a move west to be with our "original" families. Five years in Western PA gave us a chance to reconnect with family and friends and the experience as sole Pastor was important to me and my ministry. Again, though, as we said farewell to St. Mark's I had a feeling that someday, somehow, we would be back.

Early in 2007 we heard that there was an opening for a Pastor at (guess where!) St. Mark's. After talking it over with Marian, meeting with the bishops of both the Southwestern PA and Lower Susquehanna Synods, we decided to enter the call process with hopes of returning to our home away from home. Now, 12 years later, I find myself preparing to preach a sermon on that very same passage that was my first sermon preached outside a seminary classroom over 22 years ago. I some small way, I can identify with Jesus's words, "I will be with you always, even to the end of the age."

As I said, there is no other way to explain our experience at St. Mark's other than to see it as God's plan. As Jesus says in the passage above, "As the Father has sent me, so I send you." It's not so much an enlistment as it is a draft; Jesus calls us to serve others through the church, then sends us where he wants us to be, not only as Pastors and their families, but as disciples of Jesus Christ in any al all walks of life.

What service has Jesus drafted you into? Where is he sending you to serve? Look back over your life and ahead to your future, where has God's plan brought you to, and where are headed? What might God have in store for you in the next 22 years and beyond?


