As [Jesus] was setting out on a journey, a man ran up and knelt before him, and asked him, "Good Teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?" <sup>18</sup>Jesus said to him, "Why do you call me good? No one is good but God alone. <sup>19</sup>You know the commandments: 'You shall not murder; You shall not commit adultery; You shall not steal; You shall not bear false witness; You shall not defraud; Honor your father and mother." <sup>20</sup>He said to him, "Teacher, I have kept all these since my youth." <sup>21</sup>Jesus, looking at him, loved him and said, "You lack one thing..." When he heard this, he was shocked and went away grieving, for he had many possessions. Mark 10:17-21a

First of all, I need to apologize. I need to say I'm sorry to the members of St. Mark's for being lax in the teaching of Biblical stewardship. I honestly believe that the members of this church would be better stewards of the gifts God has given them if they were taught sound principles of what the Bible says, and what God calls us to do. As pastor, shepherd of this "flock", it is ultimately my responsibility to lead the congregation in the way God is calling us to go and so it is ultimately my responsibility to teach the principles of Godly giving. In the past I have shied away from such teaching in the hope that leading by example would be enough but, partly because my financial example is not public knowledge, that approach has not worked. So, as is my duty, obligation, and responsibility, I am vowing to do whatever I can in the future to lead the members of this church down the path of Biblical stewardship in whatever ways and for however long it takes. With that promise in mind, I share the story of "The Rich Young Man" from the Gospel of Mark.

As I think about my ministry here at St. Mark's and, even more importantly, the ministry of the members of this congregation, I can't help but think about how much we are blessed, and how much we have been a blessing to the community and others around the world. We have a beautiful, modern building that has had a few recent renovations that have enhanced the ministry we are able to do here. We have talented people who are willing and able to support our work with their time, talents, and money. We have been able to reach out to the neighborhood around us with support for the Central PA Food Bank, the Ecumenical Food Pantry and Nutripacks program. We have invited our neighbors in for the Community Breakfast, and begun "The Table" worship to reach those who are more comfortable with that style of worship.

Our offerings support not only the work of this congregation but also the work of the church in the world through the outreach of The Lower Susquehanna Synod, the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America, Lutheran World Relief, Lutheran Disaster Response and others. Our blessings have been blessings to others, both known and unknown to us. We have, in many ways, been like the young man in the passage above, rich in many ways, and doing good things with our riches.

Jesus loved that young man for his desire to do what was right in order to inherit eternal life. He loved him because he had done his best to keep the commandments which he thought were the key to eternal life. But, in his love for him, Jesus is also brutally honest in telling him, "You lack one thing...."

As we take stock of our many "riches" here at St. Mark's we recognize the blessing of those who give their time to the work of our various ministries, volunteering to do work that is vitally important to the church and community. We have a desire to do the right thing according to God's will for us and the church. I believe that, like the rich young man, our heart is in the right place. But, remember Jesus' brutal honesty about the young man's lacking "one thing."

You may be familiar with the part of the story I left out. Jesus tells the rich man to "go, sell what you own, and give the money to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me." The rich young man had Godly desires, but his faith was sadly misplaced. What he lacked was the willingness to let go of his earthly possessions and trust his future to God. While he was hoping for eternal life he was holding on tightly to the things of this life for comfort and security.

Faith is largely a matter of in whom or in what we place our trust. God demanded tithes and offerings of the Israelites as a way of teaching them to rely on God rather than trusting in themselves or their riches. Our stewardship today, of money, time, and anything else God has given us, can also be a learning experience. By growing in our giving, we can learn just how much God has to give. We can learn that our security is in the love of God shown to us in Jesus Christ, not in our savings accounts. I'm not saying that we should literally sell everything we own and give the money to the poor, but perhaps it is time we realize that we, too, might be "lacking one thing."

#### October 2018 Parish Post Article From Council President

Moving into the fall we change gears from summer fun to a host of activity St. Mark's has a great deal to anticipate with the resumption of Sunday School classes for all ages, music programs, and youth and family activities to name a few. This is also a busy time for the Congregation Council as we prepare to close out one calendar year and begin another. Soon you will be able to view the entire church events calendar online, anytime. Watch our website and Facebook page for more information about this new resource. Here's a rundown of some other important items happening between now and the end of 2018.

The Council recently appointed Chairpersons for the various standing ministries of St. Mark's. Our Ministries are responsible for the vast majority of the work and activity that occurs in our church. Without the dedicated leadership and volunteers of these ministries we would be unable to accomplish our mission. That being said, we do still have plenty of opportunities for volunteers to support our ministries. I encourage you to contact Pastor Person or me if you feel called to serve in any capacity. We would be happy to help you find a place to contribute what gifts you have to offer.

The process of budgeting for 2019 is now underway Please pray for those who will be working to prepare our operating budget. In each of the last three years, St. Mark's has operated at a deficit (expenses exceeding contributions) well into the second half of the year. Even though the church has operated within the budget approved by the Congregation, giving has consistently lagged behind necessitating special appeals. When considering our 2019 budget, the Finance Ministry and Council will no doubt be challenged to balance the need for expanding our ministry while spending no more than what we actually expect our members to support.

Please mark your calendars for Sunday November 18 for the annual meeting of the Congregation of St. Mark's. During this meeting the Congregation will have the opportunity to hear reports from our Council regarding the business of the church. In addition, voting members will be asked to approve the 2019 budget and nominees to various positions such as Council, Nursery School Board, audit committee, endowment committee, delegates to Synod Assembly, and nominating committee. We look forward to your participation!

Accepted annual evaluations of church staff

Approved disbursements from undesignated Evangelism Fund money, \$240 for purchase of a movie exhibition license Approved disbursements from undesignated Building Fund money, \$1,950 for removal of two trees along South Arlington Avenue

Approved disbursements from undesignated Memorial Fund money, \$371 for purchase of one plaque for the Meditation Garden

#### Ukraine Mission Trip: Part 3 - Yospivka, here we come!

The purpose of this mission trip was to conduct an English-speaking bible camp for children living in the remote village of Petrodolina. However, since there was so much controversy, the school that was to host the camp pulled out (understandably). By God's grace, the school's principal at the next village, Yospivka, was familiar with Pastor Alexander and East European Missions Network (EEMN). She enthusiastically approved the request for our camp to use their facilities, and things were pulled together like clockwork. Her kitchen crew prepared breakfast and lunch for 120+ children and adults every day. They had classrooms and bathrooms prepared for occupancy. In addition, another summer program was being held during the same week, so arrangements were made to ensure space was available to each party at the appropriate times.

Our (the American missionaries and interpreters) day began with breakfast prepared by Alyona (Pr. Alexander's wife) and we boarded a shuttle bus with other Petrodolina children to Yospivka by 0800. We had a devotion and debrief with our interpreters, and then spent a few minutes on classroom preparations before greeting our students in the auditorium at 0900. The children sang songs and had a bible theme lesson for the day, presented by either Pr. Alexander or Pr. Oleg. Then each class washed up before having breakfast together. The children LOVED trying to teach me Russian to name the food I was eating and the utensils I was using. We then focused on a rotation of 4 English-speaking lessons, crafts, music, sports and of course, lunch. The day ended with class dismissal at 3:00 PM followed by a debrief and the bus ride home. We were greeted by some type of sweet snack prepared by Alyona. Our evenings consisted of some free time, a delicious dinner (Alyona was sooooo busy!) and devotion led by one of the American missionaries. My turn was after the first day of class. The theme I chose was about standing strong through adversity, supported by the Diana Ross song, "Ain't No Mountain High Enough." Needless to say, I was the most soulfully energetic one of the bunch!

I was blessed to have Oleysa as my interpreter. She is 18 years old, and already working as a teacher for 2 years, so she had that great "command" voice to get the children to settle down. Our class had mostly 10-11 year olds, and later in the week, we had a 16 year old who was hanging out in the school yard earlier in the week observing what was taking place at the school.

The class loved the games that accompanied our bible lessons and were very snack-oriented as a reward for participation.

The week flew by in a blink of an eye. We prepared small gifts for each of them from your donations, consisting of bible verse bookmarks, pens, crosses, emoji tissues, post-it notes (they don't have those, and are fascinated by them) and assorted candies.

I'd like to share what got me through this exhausting week. The prayer chain was instrumental, it allowed me to express concerns and share them with you. Knowing that I had your thoughts and prayers surrounding me is priceless. My roommate, Norine, was a great sounding board. My lessons became more creative because of our conversations, and



I was able to easily incorporate changes the following day. My Bible app devotions were randomly selected, and "spot on" every morning. They even helped a fellow missionary who was really struggling with conflict in her class. And finally, our second night there after we learned more details of Pr. Alexander and the village chairman's injuries, I listened to one of my favorite sermons from Charlie Roberts last year about the struggles St. Paul had on one of his journeys. Miss you, man!


