Our online presence is a real blessing for those who are unable to attend worship services or Bible study. Those of you joining us remotely are still very much a part of our faith community and we appreciate your participating in whatever way you can. I would, though, invite you to be a part of our in -person experience whenever you can. Your presence adds as much, or more, to our gatherings than you might take away. I often compare online gatherings to watching a sporting event on TV, you might have a good view of the game, but it is much more rewarding to be surrounded by, and add to, the excitement of being in the stadium or arena. When you are not with us, you are missed, whether you realize it or not. As the saying goes, "The more the merrier." We are both blessed and a blessing when we "meet together" as the book of Hebrews encourages us to do.

I recently finished reading The Autobiography of Theodore Roosevelt and found in it an interesting

quote which, with a bit of editing, seems very fitting to us as church members. In the original quote, Mr. Roosevelt was writing about his feelings towards labor unions. In the edited version I offer here, I have replaced his references to unions, etc. with references to the church and Christians:

"If I were a [Christian] of any sort, I would undoubtedly join the [church] of my [denomination]. If I disapproved of its policy, I would join in order to fight that policy; if the [church] leaders were dishonest, I would join in order to put them out. I believe in the [church] and I believe that all [people] who are benefited by the [church] are morally bound to help to the extent of their power in the common interests advanced by the [church]."

Every voice, every idea, every need, every contribution, and, of course, every person, is important to God and so is important to the church. When COVID forced us to close our doors and then to limit gatherings, many of us felt robbed of one of the most important aspects of our faith life. Now that restrictions are lifted, and we are returning to a full schedule of worship and other activities we have an opportunity to reclaim what was taken from us over three years ago. When we closed our doors, we held on to the **hope** that we would soon be together again. Together, we can once again take up the church's mission of **love and good deeds**. When we meet together, we can **encourage one another**, especially when we face struggles with change, inflation, unrest, and the many other challenges that seem to be worsening as church involvement wanes.

Recently, Marian and I were invited to celebrations at our home church, which is celebrating 250 years of history, and my internship congregation, which is celebrating its 200th anniversary. This year, St. Mark's will be 64 years old and, going back to our days as Shoop's Church we will be 239 years old. These are not "milestone" anniversaries, but they show the longevity of our faithful congregation. That longevity is the fulfillment of Jesus' promise that he would build his church and "even the gates Hades will not prevail against it."

Generation after generation has recognized the importance of being part of a Christian congregation, not just attached, but involved. Together we make each other better. I am thrilled that our online presence has been a blessing to so many who may not have had access to worship or church activities otherwise. But, again, I urge you to join us in-person if, and when, you can. As Jesus tells the Pharisees in the Gospel of Mark, "The Sabbath was made for humankind, not humankind for the Sabbath." We have been given a wonderful gift in the opportunity to come together at least once a week to share and strengthen our faith. To quote a TV commercial from the past, "Try it, you'll like it

What's one of the top characteristics for missionaries in the field? BE FLEXIBLE. We can plan all we want, but God has a plan for us way before we had the first thought of what we wanted to do.

At this writing, our third attempt to ship VBS and child victim supplies to me has not arrived. I managed backup plans for both ministries and pray that current supplies are sufficient. When the package finally arrives, they will be used at the sex trafficking shelter and programs at neighboring communes with large numbers of impoverished children. Any remaining supplies can be used at next year's VBS!

Our theme for our inaugural English speaking VBS is love, focusing on John 3:16 and major highlights of Jesus' life. The Romanian helpers did not know what program to expect, and kept reminding me to present something "fun" for the kids. After attending a similar VBS program at another church, I think our program will rate as "super fun." I will put together a presentation next month for those interested in seeing what my definition of "super fun" entails.

Speaking of the future, I will be stateside the second week of July until the end of the year. As I was pondering options for a financial shuffle, the Holy Spirit guided a reunification of a former colleague with me for a short-term project with the Commonwealth's Department of Aging. Again, my fiancé and I had to make the difficult to decision to be apart after finally being in the same country together for 11 days. So, we're back to plans for winter nuptials with God's blessing.

I look forward to seeing you all again in person. As information, I still wear a mask in public indoor places as a precaution, even though I am fully vaccinated against COVID. But I'm sure you'll still be able to recognize me!
