There are different kinds of spiritual gifts, but they all come from the same Spirit. There are different ways to serve the same Lord, and we can each do different things. Yet the same God works in all of us and helps us in everything we do. Together you are the body of Christ. Each one of you is part of his body. 1 Corinthians 12:4-6, 27 (The Message)

The twelfth chapter of First Corinthians is probably one of the most quoted chapters of scripture when it comes to the healthy working of the church. This is the chapter where Paul names the many spiritual gifts shared by church members and notes that all the members of the church are meant to work together like the many parts of the body. He also warns that a healthy congregation, like a healthy body, is dependent on the many parts working together for the good of the whole.

A more modern analogy, perhaps more fitting to our sports-crazy culture, is that of a team made up of many athletes who depend on each other for the success of the team. I used this example at a recent Congregation Council meeting to point out the urgent need for teamwork as we work through what many sports teams call a "rebuilding phase".

For two years activity in the church was limited. Due to those limitations involvement of members was limited as well. We were like the National League players who were unable to have early spring practices due to a labor dispute. The St. Mark's team was still here, we were as active as we could be, but many of our once active teammates were unable to be as involved as they would have liked. *The time has come, though, for those who were once active, and those have not been so active, to get off the bench and into the game!*

MISSION STATEMENT: Nourished by Word and Sacrament, the mission of the members of St. Mark's Evangelical Lutheran Church is to spread God's Word in Jesus Christ through our thoughts, words, and actions, proclaiming God's good news for all to hear and live.

One of the first and most enlightening things I learned at seminary is that the word “liturgy” means “work of the people.” Our worship is called “liturgical” because it is an activity in which “the people”, the team members, are all involved. (Besides, more people involved prevents the pastor becoming too boring!)

There are many opportunities to serve St. Mark’s as we sustain the life of the resurrected church following the pandemic limitations. Some are front and center, others are behind the scenes, but all are vital to the life and health of our congregation. The more visible ways to serve include lectors to read the lessons on Sunday, Communion assistants to distribute the wine, and ushers to help with offering, seating, and generally watch over things during worship. We can once again enlist Worship Assistants to offer prayers and help with other parts of the liturgy. For those musically inclined, Joyce will always welcome members into the Chancel Choir and Bell Choir. And acolytes, usually thought of as the job of the youth, are not limited by age, just ask Bob Gill or Ed Shadle. Training is available for anyone who is, or thinks they might be, interested in serving in any of these positions. We are also thinking of ways to make participating more “doer friendly” so more people will be more comfortable taking part.

Behind the scenes we have several ministries that go about the work of the church both internally and in the community. If there is some way you would like to get involved, I’m sure we can find a place for you. Ministries include: Stewardship, Finance, Communications, Fellowship, Social Services, Christian Education, Property, Evangelism, Worship-Music-and Arts, Youth & Family, Mutual Ministry, and Administration & Records. We also have a Nursery School Board, Women of the ELCA, Lutheran Men in Mission, A Nominating Committee, a Servant’s Heart Scholarship Committee, and at times have had ad hoc task forces as needed.

You can tell from that list, there is a place for everyone to offer skills, interests, or abilities for the well-being of the Body of Christ. Show Me the Way

The Lord speaks to us in countless ways. For me, He speaks through scripture, song, conversations, dreams, de ja vu, and other infinitesimal ways throughout my day. Please reflect on this story and tell me, what would you do as a follower of Christ?

A female person of color read a text from a friend in another country, requesting assistance to transport a large sum of money through 4 countries to help Christian friends in a war-torn area. (No, it was not a money-laundering scheme, it was a sizable legitimate donation!) She responded immediately, "What do you need me to do," without regard to safety or circumstance. The checkpoints through the neighboring countries were crowded, confusing, chaotic, and permitted passage rules may change at the whim of the border guards. Initially, she was an ideal candidate to cross the borders because of her gender, and ability to navigate unfamiliar territory with relative ease. Within 24 hours, various scenarios were explored to develop a plan to transport dollars from country #1 to country #2. Country #2 would receive the money and convert to their own currency. Country #2 would transport funds to Country #3 and exchange to Country #4's currency, and transport said funds to Country 4's destination.

During this planning phase, the woman contacted her family and pastors to relay her involvement in this situation. Her closest "bubble" remained steadfast in fervent love and continued to pray that safety in the Lord's work would prevail.

Challenges arose because the large sum was not readily available in the subsequent countries, and time was of the essence. Numerous calls to contacts in neighboring countries were made. Many internet searches were researched for itineraries by airplane, bus, car, and on foot. News was relayed that people of color, regardless of gender were being detained at the border. Then God opened our eyes. Country #2 had a contact in Country #3 who had a relative that worked in a currency exchange office. Because of this relationship, the best conversion rate was obtained. Country #3 had a contact who frequented the border of Country #4 and saw the border guards twice a day to bring food and clothing to refugees and transport refugees to safety. He had dual citizenship and was retired, and could freely transfer amongst neighboring borders. Within 72 hours, the plan came to fruition and the money arrived safely in the hands of the intended recipient. Praise the Lord!

What good is it, my brothers and sisters, if someone claims to have faith but has no deeds? Can such a faith save them? Suppose a brother or a sister is without clothes and daily food. If one of you says to them, "Go in peace; keep warm and well fed," but does nothing about their physical needs, what good is it? In the same way, faith by itself, if it is not accompanied by action, is dead.

But if someone will say, "You have faith; I have deeds."

Show me your faith without deeds, and I will show you my faith by my deeds. (James 2:14-18)

You are a baptized follower of Christ, affirmed to live as He taught. What will you do today to show your love of Jesus?
