Eucharistic Prayer & Words of Institution

Holy One, the beginning and the end, the giver of life:

Blessed are you for the birth of Creation.

Blessed are you in the darkness and the light.

Blessed are you for your promise to your people.

Blessed are you in the prophets' hopes and dreams.

Blessed are you for Mary's openness and will.

Blessed are you for your Son Jesus, the Word made flesh, who this night comes to dwell among us.

On the night in which our Lord Jesus was betrayed, He took bread, and gave thanks; broke it, and gave it to His disciples, saying:
