INTRODUCTION

From the time of the Apostles the Church has united together in worship of our Triune God through a service centered on two parts, mirroring the experience of the two disciples on the road to Emmaus where the resurrected Jesus made Himself known through the Word of God and the breaking of bread (Luke 24:13-31). The first section, the Service of the Word, grew out of the worship practices of first century Jewish synagogues, which focused upon the reading and preaching of particular Scriptural texts. The second portion, the Service of the Sacrament, developed around the celebration of the Lord's Supper, which Jesus bestowed upon His Church prior to His crucifixion. Through the services of Word and Sacrament our Triune God continues to make Himself manifest in our lives and worship. Our Lord continues to use the liturgy to convert and strengthen His people, drawing us together as the Body of Christ. Today we celebrate four aspects of our worship, Gathering, Word, Meal, and Sending

Stand CONFESSION AND FORGIVENESS (ABSOLUTION)

We acknowledge our sins beginning with the words of 1 John 1:8-9. The pastor then forgives all repentant sinners in God's stead and by His command (John 20:23).

P If we say we have no sin we deceive ourselves and the truth is not in us. But if we confess our sin, God who is faithful and just, will forgive our sins and cleanse us from all unrighteousness.

Let us confess our sin in the presence of God and of one another.

The assembly kneels or stands. Silence is kept for reflection.

P Most merciful God,

C we confess that we are captive to sin and cannot free ourselves. We have sinned against you in thought, word, and deed, by what we have done and by what we have left undone. We have not loved you with our whole heart; we have not loved our neighbors as ourselves. For the sake of your Son, Jesus Christ, have mercy on us. Forgive us, renew us, and lead us, so that we may delight in your will and walk in your ways, to the glory of your holy name.

C. Amen.

P In the mercy of almighty God, Jesus Christ was given to die for us, and for his sake God forgives us all our sins. As a called and ordained minister of the church of Christ, and by his authority, I therefore declare to you the entire forgiveness of all your sins, in the name of the Father, and of the + Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

C Amen.

Stand GREETING

P The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with you all.

KYRIE (Spoken)

"Lord, have mercy" is a translation of the Greek Kyrie eleison (pronounced Kee-ree-yay e-lay-son). Our crying out for mercy upon entering the presence of the living God indicates we are aware of our own unrighteousness, and of the righteousness that He freely gives us. We use the same words as the ten lepers, "Jesus, have mercy on us" (Luke 17:13).

THE SALUTATION

Keep us steadfast in your word, and when we fall, raise us again and restore us through your Son, Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.
