Just as you were once disobedient to God but have now received mercy because of their disobedience, so they have now been disobedient in order that, by the mercy shown to you, they too may now receive mercy. For God has imprisoned all in disobedience so that he may be merciful to all.

The Holy Gospel according to St Matthew the 15th Chapter C Glory to you O Lord

Gospel: Matthew 15:[10-20] 21-28

Jesus teaches his disciples that true purity is a matter of the heart rather than outward religious observances. Almost immediately, this teaching is tested when a woman considered to be a religious outsider approaches him for help.

[Jesus] called the crowd to him and said to them, "Listen

and understand: it is not what goes into the mouth that defiles a person, but it is what comes out of the mouth that defiles." Then the disciples approached and said to him, "Do you know that the Pharisees took offense when they heard what you said?" He answered, "Every plant that my heavenly Father has not planted will be uprooted. Let them alone; they are blind guides of the blind. And if one blind person guides another, both will fall into a pit." But Peter said to him, "Explain this parable to us." Then he said, "Are you also still without understanding? Do you not see that whatever goes into the mouth enters the stomach, and goes out into the sewer? But what comes out of the mouth proceeds from the heart, and this is what defiles. For out of the heart come evil intentions, murder, adultery, fornication, theft, false witness, slander. These are what defile a person, but to eat with unwashed hands does not defile."

Jesus left that place and went away to the district of Tyre and Sidon. Just then a Canaanite woman from that region came out and started shouting, "Have mercy on me, Lord, Son of David; my daughter is tormented by a demon." But he did not answer her at all. And his disciples came and urged him, saying, "Send her away, for she keeps shouting after us." He answered, "I was sent only to the lost sheep of the house of Israel." But she came and knelt before him, saying, "Lord, help me." He answered, "It is not fair to take the children's food and throw it to the dogs." She said, "Yes, Lord, yet even the dogs eat the crumbs that fall from their masters' table." Then Jesus answered her, "Woman, great is your faith! Let it be done for you as you wish." And her daughter was healed instantly.

Brock Hillside Chapel to Recognize Marianne

Brock's Ministry at Nawakwa / LCC



This past April, Marianne Brock, Nawakwa's long time and beloved Camp Director/LCC Associate Executive Director, left the LCC Outdoor Ministry staff after 25 years of devoted service, for a ministry position as the Regional Gift Planner for the ELCA

Foundation. Nawakwa has a long history of honoring those whose ministry legacies have been significant to the camp - Fischer Chapel, Grove Lodge, Bishop Chapel - are examples. To honor Marianne's ministry legacy, a Hillside Chapel will be developed beyond Brenneman Lodge and named in her honor. The chapel will feature a stone fire pit and three terraced seating areas with walls made from stone harvested around the camp, set scenically among shade trees.

The chapel is being funded by donations of those who wish to honor Marianne's ministry and by a distribution from the LCC General Endowment Fund.
